

THE STATE OF WORKPLACE EDUCATION IN THE STATES

IDAHO

Funding

- Money spent on workplace education in Idaho is composed of 70% Federal funds and 30% state funds. While Idaho does not set aside a specific amount of money for workplace education, it does participate in matching.
- Additionally, employers contribute through targeted contributions when programs are specific to their company and through in-kind donations by lending space.

Current Initiatives

Idaho has no current initiatives in workplace education. At the local level, some workplace education does take place.

Barriers to Workplace Education

- The primary barrier to workplace education in Idaho is that employers are reluctant to fund it.
- Adult Basic Education in Idaho does not have enough staff to undertake the type of relationship building that successful workplace education programs necessitate.

Location of programs

- 90% of workplace education programs are offered on-site.
